MUSEUMS

♦ Museum of Fine Arts

This dynamic cultural complex comprises of two gallery buildings, a sculpture garden, a visitor's center, a movie theatre, a café, two art schools, and two house museums.

♦ The Health Museum

This museum is Houston's most interactive science learning museum, and is also a member of the world renowned Texas medical center. It was made to foster wonder and curiosity about health, medical science, and the human body.

♦ Teo-Chew Buddhist Temple

♦ Co-Cathedral of the Sacred Heart

♦ Annunciation Greek Orthodox Cathedral

A center for Orthodox education, ministry, and Greek cultural events in Houston. Held in the domed church are Byzantine icons, which include sacred paintings of Jesus Christ, the Virgin Mary, and the Angels and Saints. Characterized by vivid colors and often gold colored backgrounds, the people depicted in the icons seem to float and have meaningful depth in their spiritual beauty.

♦ Glenwood Cemetery

Ancient Indian arts, traditions and philosophy have been encompassed in this house of devotion and worship that is a testimony to human commitment.

◆ George Bush Park

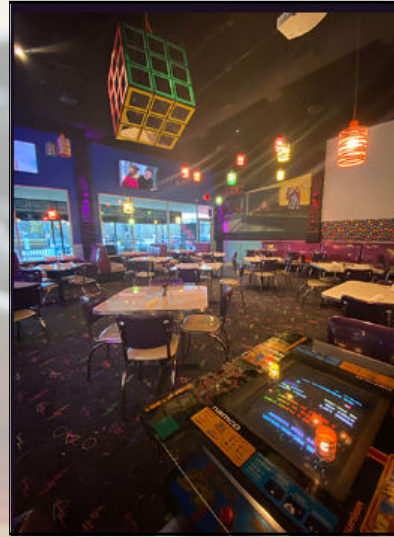

◆ Bolivar Ferry in Galveston

The free ferry service provided by the Texas Department of Transportation is the only way motorists can cross the waterway between Bolivar Peninsula and Galveston Island.

◆ San Jacinto Monument Observation Deck
